South Sudan

Christian Mercy International, Paulino Malou Pray For:

- The health of children at Marial Baai, as malaria rates are very high due to heavy rains and flooding. Please pray for Paulino, the CMI Director, who is not feeling well due to the malarial outbreak across Aweil.
- The fighting of misinformation about COVID-19 vaccines. Paulino has been mandated by the Ministry of Health to raise awareness with Churches of Christ leaders, encouraging them to be vaccinated. The community is struggling with the idea that COVID-19 is a disease that only white people get. There are also concerns about the vaccine's effects on fertility, pregnant and breastfeeding mothers and their babies.

- That Emmanuel School has received and planted many seedlings. Growing vegetables at the school has helped with children's health and nutrition.
- That the renovations of the Marial Baai Church of Christ in Aweil West County have been approved. The building will be plastered, painted and given benches so that the church can better operate.

Thailand

Church of Christ Thailand (CCT), Tewin Somchit

Prav For:

The border communities of Thailand and Myanmar. Conflict in Myanmar has
increased, leading to refugees crossing the border. Many of these communities are
facing economic and health crises because of COVID-19. Please pray that these
communities will be safe, and that the Thai government will provide shelter and
support to these vulnerable people.





- The planning of the 2022 budget. Adjustments need to be made to accommodate the challenges of the pandemic. Pray that these will be addressed sensitively, with hope and determination to fulfil the planned activities.
- A child under the care of Hope Home, a SDSU (Social Development and Services Unit) partner, who has been in intensive care. Thankfully her symptoms have improved, and she has been able to leave hospital. Please pray for her continued recovery, and for the staff and children of Hope Home as they work to prevent COVID-19 infections.
- Child Protection workshops planned for ethnic minority groups in Chiang Rai Province. Pray that travel will be possible so that this important work can take place.

Vietnam

Churches of Christ in Vietnam, Ps T Pray For:

- Vietnam as we enter the fourth month of social distancing and lockdowns. Many people face difficulties, especially in terms of accessing food and necessities. Please pray that the infection rate will fall.
- The families and friends of those who have died from COVID-19.

Praise God:

• That the North and Highlands regions are not epidemic areas, so it is stable there. Church leaders gather there to pray together at the beginning of each month.

Zimbabwe

Associated Churches of Christ in Zimbabwe, BJ Mpofu Pray For:

 God to make available the places that most need water. Work is beginning on the next round of boreholes. Pray that there will be a 100% success rate as there was in the last round.

- For a bountiful harvest last season which has gone a long way toward alleviating hunger in many households now. The basic staple food (maize meal) is available for most people.
- For a successful COVID-19 vaccine rollout program in the rural areas, as more people are coming forward for vaccination.
- That rural community visits can happen more freely as the lockdown restrictions have been eased.
