Highlights from the Nyozani Circuit, Zimbabwe

Evangelist Mahlangu from the Nyozani Circuit shares exciting developments in youth and children's ministry. Three young people decided to follow Jesus at a recent combined youth service in Bulawayo. Four Valleys Church of Christ has established a new children's program. The youth at Lochard and Inyozani Churches of Christ will mould bricks when the rainy season ends, allowing for the construction of two new church buildings. The evangelist shares: "We will be holding a young preacher's workshop to equip young people with the skills for pulpit ministry."

Midwifery Program in Bangladesh

A Midwifery program was launched in 2024 to empower women by helping them achieve self-reliant income to support their families. The first 15 graduates have since been employed at various private and public hospitals and clinics throughout Bangladesh. Stafy Bawm dreamed of becoming a nurse. She shared, "I learned how to serve people with love and care, and now I am serving the people with love and care".

Emerging Leaders Supported through the Indigenous Pathways Program

Jessie and Yilleen are two emerging young leaders participating in our partner Dhiiyaan's True Fella program. This year, both men will receive support through our Indigenous Ministries Australia Pathways program to attend two On Country Immersion trips, where they will be mentored by Indigenous leaders, Billy Jangala Williams and Luke Houghton.

Abundant Water for Pertunia

In Zimbabwe, Pertunia, a mother of four who is new to her village, joins the many women on their daily trek to collect water from a contaminated river that is drying up. Some days, she waits in line until ten o'clock at night, only to return home empty-handed, contemplating how she will try again tomorrow.

Pertunia's husband passed away, so all her household duties, plus her family's survival, are now her sole responsibility. She needs water to drink, bathe, wash clothes and keep her home tidy. Pertunia wants to help her children grow up strong, but collecting water from an unsafe source doesn't help.

The ongoing drought in Zimbabwe is causing riverbeds to dry up. Without access to a borehole, communities like Pertunia's are forced to search for any available water source. This practice is unsafe and often leads to illness and other community development issues.

Our Relief and Development partner, Showers of Blessing, helps people like Pertunia access water from a safe and permanent water source close to their homes by installing boreholes. With your support, Showers of Blessing went to Pertunia's village to determine the best location for drilling a borehole for her community. It was on Pertunia's land!

Fortunately, Pertunia had heard about the benefits of a borehole, which gave her motivation. "I said they can go ahead and drill," she replied.

The community worked together to clear access roads for the drilling through Pertunia's land.

Pertunia praises the community's efforts in supporting the borehole project. She was particularly happy about how "everyone worked together!"

After many years of collecting water from the river, Pertunia now has a community borehole on her land and will never be empty-handed again.

The borehole flows continuously, providing more than enough water for her and her community.

"I am happy because I had challenges in accessing water, [but] today, we've

managed to plant our own vegetables. We were confined to buying from other villages. Now we can plant our vegetables and sell them later," she shared.

Pertunia believes Showers of Blessing was a divine intervention that has significantly benefited her community. "It is God's work. He remembered our community," she said.

Grateful for the improvements brought by the borehole, Pertunia explains how she feels: "The way I see it? I'm just happy!"

Healing the Trauma After the Earthquake

The earthquake that struck Vanuatu on December 17, 2024, was devastating. Despite this, when I arrived in Port Vila this May, the air was full of anticipation and hope.

Local pastors and leaders were gathering for Healing the Trauma workshops.

Healing the Trauma is a series of workshops created by our partners, the Churches of Christ Conference of Vanuatu (CCCV). The workshops help participants explore how trauma impacts their thoughts, emotions, and bodies. It also gives them opportunities to share their stories.

Your generous donations to the Vanuatu Earthquake Appeal enabled us to respond to the situation quickly. Following the earthquake, Global Mission Partners collaborated with CCCV to assess the damage. Our partners delivered local materials and emergency supplies to those affected in the areas.

Now, our focus is on helping people cope with the ongoing trauma caused by the earthquake. This is through workshops, counselling, pastoral care, and help in accessing local services. Healing the Trauma workshops are part of this approach.

At the beginning of March, six church leaders in Luganville, Santo, were trained as facilitators for Healing the Trauma. They then travelled to Port Vila to conduct the training with 12 church leaders, pastors, and chiefs. Workshops have been facilitated in the community as a result.


In April, another team, this time 13 people, participated in the Healing the Trauma training in Luganville. This team then conducted training for 60 other leaders in Port Vila. These 60 leaders will facilitate workshops for Sunday Schools, youth groups, schools and women's and men's programs.

During my visit, I observed the training run at a local school. I listened to biblical passages that discussed what it means to bring our concerns and fears to God. I also heard many powerful stories, as we explored ways to identify and address trauma.

Each trainer brought their own moving stories. I was captivated by their resilience and commitment to healing.

My fondest memory is hearing the heartfelt stories of several young Christian leaders. They shared with me, sitting under a

mango tree in front of the Sarabetu Church. Young leaders, both women and men, are dedicating their lives to serve their local communities in the face of natural disasters. These commitments are driven by a desire to stand up for God. What an inspiration!

Watching the leaders gather, I could see their joy radiating from the time together. They encouraged one another and shared ideas on how to transform their communities. I was deeply encouraged by this experience.

Please pray for the teams as they train and continue to support the people of Port Vila over the coming months. May healing take place in the lives of many people experiencing post-traumatic stress and physical and emotional suffering.

My experience visiting Port Vila wasn't just about learning. It was a celebration of faith, resilience, and the human capacity to heal and uplift one another. I left full of hope, inspired by the strength of these Christian leaders. Leaders who are making a difference, even in the face of adversity.




Top: A childs drawing from the workshop showing their exerience before and after the workshop.

Appointing Pastor Bin in Vietnam

In April, Global Mission Partners' CEO, John Lamerton, and Major Gifts Manager, Craig Brown, undertook an urgent trip to Vietnam. The leader of the Vietnam Churches of Christ, Pastor Doan, had suffered a debilitating stroke.

Pastor Doan has been responsible for leading a small network of churches in Vietnam for over ten years. When she had the stroke, Doan was unable to communicate, so the church leaders had to make some new adjustments. They were mostly trying to understand the breadth of Pastor Doan's role and determining who was responsible for what came next.

Church representatives gathered with John and Craig in Ho Chi Minh City to discuss the next steps forward. In the space of a day, an updated partnership agreement was signed, a new committee formed, and Pastor Nguyen Tan Bin was appointed as the National Director for the Churches of Christ in Vietnam, pending an official vote in 18 months.

Pastor Bin resides in Central Vietnam, with his wife, daughter, and son, where he leads the local Church of Christ. Pastor Bin is a natural networker with a proactive approach to ministry. He has recruited new churches to join the Vietnam Churches of Christ, with a vision to assist vulnerable people.

"As the National Representative of the Church of Christ in Vietnam, my current challenge is to expand God's work to more provinces nationwide." Pastor Bin explained.

"Under Pastor Bin's leadership, the Churches of Christ in Vietnam are in good hands," Craig said. "He has worked closely with Global Mission Partners over the years, is well respected within the movement and is a strong leader."

Pastor Bin shared how you can support him in his new role, "I ask you to pray for my ministry so that God may grant me the grace to fulfil His calling."

At the end of their trip to Vietnam, John and Craig were able to visit Pastor Doan, whose recovery was progressing slowly but well. They prayed for her, and she was able to understand the changes and give her blessing to Pastor Bin.

11 Indigenous Young People Attend Youth Alive Event in Mildura

The Dareton Youth and Community Centre took 11 young people to a local Youth Alive event in Mildura, Victoria. This was an answer to prayer, as the youth had never participated in an event like this before. Clinton, the chairman of the youth centre, reflected, "It was great to see these young people come and share in this experience with around 110 other youth, all there to hear about God as well as worship and praise him." Some of the young people started listening to the songs after the event and shared how they really enjoyed themselves.

Discipleship Program for Local Pastors in Indonesia

Hery Susanto, Director at the Christian Church Theological School of Indonesia, was invited to facilitate discipleship training with local teachers, farmers, carpenters, and livestock breeders. Participants are also pastors, both husbands and wives, who serve in local churches. Hery noted, "The knowledge from this discipleship program is helping them to run their businesses according to God's kingdom guidelines."

Promoting Hygiene for Women and Girls in India

Our partner, Hosanna Ministries, encourages women living in poverty to attend workshops on menstrual hygiene to understand the importance of using sanitary pads.



One participant shared, "I have two teenage daughters. They used old cotton cloths and often reused the same cloth, which caused discomfort and health problems." During workshops, women and girls receive sanitary pads. Now, the participant is better equipped to help her daughters. Understanding the importance of sanitary pads significantly benefits the personal hygiene and overall health of women and girls living in the squatter community.
