Day 1 — Sunday, 30 November 2025

Incarnation and Presence

Scriptures:

John 1:14 (NIV) — “And the Word became flesh and dwelt among us...”

1 John 4:7a, 9,12 (NIV) Dear friends, let us love one another, for love comes from God... This is how God showed his love among us: He sent his one and only Son into the world... No one has ever seen God; but if we love one another, God lives in us and his love is made complete in us.

Reflection:

The incarnation is God’s ultimate act of solidarity — God chooses not to stay distant but to live in our reality, fully human, fully present with our suffering. As disciples, we are called to embody this presence, entering the lives of those on the margins with compassion and humility.

Quote:

Karl Barth: “The Word of God, which we call Jesus Christ, is the true and complete revelation of God’s self-giving love, who condescends to our human condition not as a distant deity but as Immanuel — God with us.”

Day 2 – Monday, 1 December 2025

Healing the Brokenhearted

Scripture:

Isaiah 61:1 (NIV) — “He has sent me to bind up the brokenhearted...”

Reflection:

Jesus’ mission reveals that healing brokenness is central to God’s kingdom. Our discipleship calls us to join this mission, partnering with local leaders worldwide who bring hope through practical care and spiritual restoration.

Quote:

Dietrich Bonhoeffer: “God is not the God ‘above’ the world, but the God who has come among us and suffers with us. To follow Christ means to share in this costly presence with the suffering world.”

Day 3 – Tuesday, 2 December 2025

Service to the Vulnerable

Scripture:

Matthew 25:40 (NIV) – “Whatever you did for one of the least of these... you did for me.”

Reflection:

Service to the vulnerable is service to Christ Himself. This radical call challenges us to prioritise those that society often overlooks, embracing the incarnational mission that sees value and dignity in every person.

Quote:

C.S. Lewis: “The Christian does not think God will love us because we are good, but that God will make us good because He loves us.”

Personal Prayer:

God, give me eyes to see Christ in the faces of the excluded and the courage to act in love and service. Amen.

Scripture:

Reflection:

God's closeness to the broken models the very heart of mission — to be near, to listen, to suffer alongside. Ministry begins with presence, not quick fixes.

Day 5 – Thursday, 4 December 2025

Radical Hospitality

Scripture:

Hebrews 13:2 (NIV) — “Do not forget to show hospitality to strangers.”

Reflection:

Hospitality is a radical act of incarnational ministry — welcoming the other or stranger as if it were Christ himself. Mission rooted in hospitality breaks down walls and builds community.

Quote:

Mother Teresa: “Not all of us can do great things. But we can do small things with great love.”

True discipleship embraces solidarity — sharing both joy and sorrow. This deep empathy shapes mission that is relational and transformative.

Scripture:

Reflection:

Comfort flows through us. Our suffering and God’s comfort empower us to minister effectively to trauma and grief, especially alongside local partners in fragile contexts.

Quote:

Dallas Willard: “Grace is the power to stand in the suffering of the world and serve it faithfully.”

Scripture:

Luke 2:7 (NIV) – “And she gave birth to her firstborn son... and laid him in a manger...”

Reflection:

The humble birth of Christ challenges worldly notions of power and prestige. God’s kingdom is upside down — a call to discipleship marked by humility and vulnerability, especially among those living in precarious conditions.

Quote:

Bonaventure: “Christ’s humility is the model for all who serve the poor and suffering.”

The light of Christ breaks into the darkest places, offering hope and renewal. Our discipleship invites us to carry and share this light where despair and exclusion prevail.

Dorothy Day reminds us that Christian love cannot be abstract. It takes form in soup kitchens, shelters, and solidarity. Love meets Christ in the poor and vulnerable. Our discipleship is tested not in lofty words but in humble service.

Quote:

Dorothy Day: “The Gospel takes away our right forever, to discriminate between the deserving and the undeserving poor.”
